


#### **Year 4/5**

Last week in our Garden session we placed pots on our new vertical garden around the rotunda. # FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

#### CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

#### HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

If you applied for the CSEF at your child's school in 2024, you do not need to complete an application form in 2024 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools in 2024 or you did not apply in 2024
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2024

Check with the school office if you are unsure.

#### Conveyance Allowance 2024

#### Private car travel to the nearest school

To be eligible for conveyance allowance:

Must be school age (between 5-18 years old)

Must attend an eligible school within the conveyance area

Must live 4.8km or more from the school by the shortest practical route

Must attend the closest same type school as designated by Victoria Registrations and Qualification Authority (VRQA)

A private car or private bus conveyance allowance is not available if the journey could have been made using a Department-funded school bus or public transport service. Reimbursement is calculated on the basis of the one-way distance travelled.

Distance is measured by the shortest practicable route between the student's place of residence and their school.

The residential address should be based on the Rural Road Numbering System. Mailbox and PO Box addresses cannot be used. You can use Bing Maps as a reference: <a href="http://www.bing.com/maps/">http://www.bing.com/maps/</a>

#### **CONVEYANCE ALLOWANCE**

If you live more than 4.8km from your nearest bus stop or school, you may be eligible for conveyance allowance. This is paid to the school and reimbursed to the parent to help with the cost of student travel to and from a student's nearest government school. Please ask at the school office for an application form. This payment is made at the end of each semester.
